Farmers' Cash Assets Increase To New High

The nation's farmers in the aggregate increased their financial assets by \$1.1 billions in 1947 to a new high of \$22.3 billions as of the first of this year according to the Bureau of Agricultural Economics, U. S. Department of Agriculture. The total is about four and one-half times that of the beginning of 1940. Financial assets consist of bank deposits, currency, U. S. Savings Bonds and investments in cooperatives.

Last year's gain was the smallest since 1940. The biggest annual gain in farmer's financial assets in the aggregate was in 1945 when they increased nearly \$4 billions.

Including the physical plant, American agriculture was estimated to be worth 122.3 billions at the beginning of this year, up \$11.8 billions over the year before and comparing with \$53.8 billions at the beginning of 1940. A large part of this gain reflects the rise in prices of farm land and other physical assets.

According to Clyde P. Patton, Executive Director of the N. C. Wildlife Resources Commission and Carl G. Krueger, Supervisor of Pisgah National Forest.

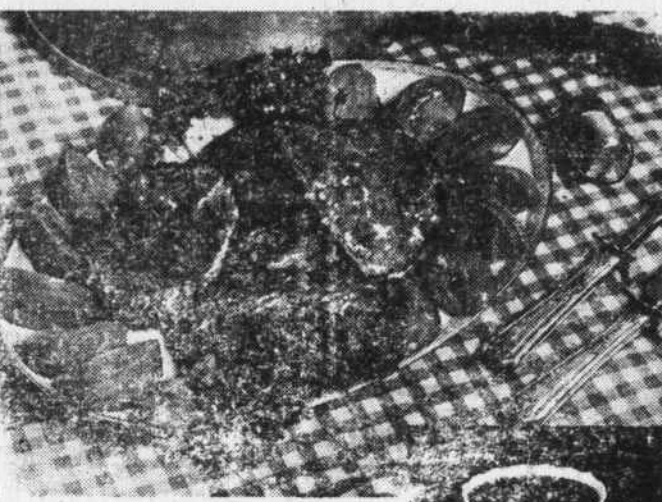
