covered by three Bryson City men, leaped high in the air on the one to make a beautiful catch and fought his way across the goal. Boston, substitute back, failed to make the extra point on an attempted placement. The half ended before the teams could line up for the kickoff.

The second half was a hard fought, bruising battle with both teams having several long runs called back by penalties. Once, during the third quarter, Franklin drove to the Bryson City 25-yard line, but lost the ball on a fumble.

Midway the fourth quarter came one of the deciding plays when Bryson City kicked from the 32-yard line. Keener took the ball on his 30-yard line and raced around his right end to the Bryson City 18-yard line. He was aided in this run by a beautiful block by Henry at about the Franklin 40-yard line. The play was nullified, however, as Franklin was penalized for roughing the kicker. The decision was disputed by the Franklin fans and Coach Milburn Atkins, but to no avail.

In the second half Bryson City was unable to penetrate beyond the Franklin 30-yard standing play of Bob Parrish, line, mostly due to the out-who undoubtedly was the best defensive man on the field.

State College Answers Timely Farm Questions

Q. Tobacco accounts for well over half of North Carolina's cash farm income. But, from the economic standpoint, how important is tobacco to the nation as a whole?

A. Tobacco was the earliest profitable export crop from the Americas. Spaniards first shipped it commercially to Europe from what is now the United States in 1511. Since that time the crop has increased in importance until it now brings growers more than one billion dollars each year. From the standpoint of Federal revenue, in the five-year period covering the fiscal years 1942-46 receipts by the U. S. Government from tobacco and related products averaged more than 950 million dollars each year. In addition most of the states collected large sums in excise taxes on sales of tobacco products. The Federal treasury receives more direct revenue from tobacco than from all other crops combined.

Q. When band placement of fertilizer is used on tobacco and the fertilizer is placed on only one side of the plant, will results be satisfactory?

A. The answer is no. Tobacco is one of the most exacting of all plants. For most crops, the type of machine that places a band of fertilizer at one side of the row gives results just as satisfactory as from a band on each side. But with most types of tobacco, research shows that a one-sided application frequently produces one-sided growth effects.

While Parrish was the outstanding defensive ball player, Keener led Franklin on the offensive. Henry also was a consistent ground gainer and was an effective blocker. Other men who played good ball for Franklin included Pattillo, Thomas, Archer, Huggins, White, Penland, and Brown.


