

## MOST OF SEAL SALE MONEY TO BE KEPT HERE

Annual Campaign Seeks Funds For Fight On Tuberculosis

Three-fourths of the money raised here through the Christmas tuberculosis seal sale, now under way, will be retained for work in this county, it was pointed out this week by R. E. (Tiny) Welch, chairman of the seal sale campaign, which is sponsored by the Franklin Lions club.

Last year \$350 was raised here, and it is hoped that this year's receipts will be larger. Mr. Welch said, adding that educational literature — telling just why the money is needed and how it is used — is being distributed through the schools.

The seals are being sold through the school children, and through letters. Letters have gone out to many persons in the community, enclosing 100 seals. Those who wish to help in the battle against tuberculosis are asked to send a dollar, in return for the seals, to Wayne Faulkner, treasurer of the campaign. Those who did not receive letters, but wish to contribute, are asked to make their checks to Mr. Faulkner.

This county's share of the funds raised will be used to

follow up the some 30 cases of tuberculosis revealed by the recent mass X-rays here, and to provide milk, medicine, extra food, and general financial help to those suffering with tuberculosis and in need of financial assistance.
