

## Fewer Veterans

### Building Homes Under G. I. Bill

Fewer and fewer veterans are obtaining home loans under the G. I. Bill, according to the Veterans administration.

Records show that G. I. loans now number only one out of every ten new small home mortgages, compared with a one-in-four ratio during the peak period of the G. I. loan guaranty program.

The VA attributes the decrease in the number of veterans' home loans to two factors: The high and rising price level for new homes; and the four per cent interest rate—the maximum which lenders may charge veterans for loans guaranteed by VA under the G. I. Bill.

Regarding the first factor, VA estimates that the average veteran family can afford a home priced at \$5,000 to \$6,000, or well below the price asked for most of the new homes under construction. Relative to the second factor, VA explained that lenders are reluctant to invest in long-term loans permitting only a gross return of four per cent.

# LIST YOUR PROPERTY NOW

Tax listers will be at the following places in the various townships on the dates given to list property for the year 1949. The Board of Commissioners asks all persons to cooperate to the fullest extent in helping the listers to get a correct list of all property. The law provides that a penalty shall be effected against any person failing to list his or her property (although this will not be applied to non-residents). All persons should make a strong effort to see the List Taker or have some person represent them and save the embarrassment of going before the Board asking for corrections when they have failed to list their property.

All property owners are required to return to the List Taker all the real estate, personal property, etc., owned by each on the first of January.

All male persons between the ages of 21 and 50 years are required by law to list their polls during January.

All persons who own property and fail to list it and who are liable for a poll tax and fail to give themselves in will be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, subject to a fine or imprisonment upon conviction.
