100-Bushel Corn Club Seeking New Members

"Are you a member of the North Carolina 100-Bushel Corn Club? If not, look up one of your neighbors who is a member and get him to sponsor you for membership in 1949."

That's the advice given to Tar Heel farmers this week by Dr. E. R. Collins, in charge of agronomy extension at State College.

Every adult farmer, 4-H Club or FFA member who belongs to the 100-Bushel Club will be asked to sponsor another person for membership this year, Dr. Collins said. As a reward, each sponsor will receive an allocation of nitrogen topdressing sufficient to take care of his own corn crop and that of the person he is sponsoring. The local county agent's office announced they had received a supply of this dressing and that it was available now.

The two growers will be expected to confer frequently concerning the choice of hybrid seed, spacing, cultivating and fertilizing practices which will result in the highest yields.

Members who decide to ac-

cept the sponsoring offer should notify their county agent. In counties where orders are large enough to justify it, cooperating fertilizing distributors will ship the topdressing material in car-load lots. Farmers will be required to accept delivery as soon as the material arrives in January, February, or March.

The 100-Bushel Club, started in 1945 for the purpose of encouraging the use of hybrid varieties and better production practices, reached membership of 638 in 1947. The total may exceed 1,500 when all reports have been received for 1948.

The club is considered one of the major factors responsible for raising the State's average corn yield from 23 bushels per acre in 1945 to an estimated 33

bushels per acre in 1948.

LIST YOUR PROPERTY NOW

Tax listers will be at the following places in the various townships on the dates given to list property for the year 1949. The Board of Commissioners asks all persons to cooperate to the fullest extent in helping the listers to get a correct list of all property. The law provides that a penalty shall be effected against any person failing to list his or her property (although this will not be applied to non-residents). All persons should make a strong effort to see the List Taker or have some person represent them and save the embarrassment of going before the Board asking for corrections when they have failed to list their property.

All property owners are required to return to the List Taker all the real estate, personal property, etc., owned by each on the first of January.

All male persons between the ages of 21 and 50 years are required by law to list their polls during January.

All persons who own property and fail to list it and who are liable for a poll tax and fail to give themselves in will be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, subject to a fine or imprisonment upon conviction.
