

In Number Injured

Injuries caused by fireworks in North Carolina have decreased sharply since the 1947 gen-eral assembly banned the sale and manufacture of fireworks in this state, according to resuls of a survey made by the Hospital Care association. Durthe Christmas season of ing 1948, the survey showed, physi-cians treated 106 patients injured by firecrackers of fireworks, while two years before the figure was 751. The survey showed two treated in Franklin in 1946 for injuries, while none was treated last Christmas.


