San Of Fireworks Reflected In Drop In Number Injured
Injuries caused by fireworks in North Carolina have decreased sharply since the 1947 general assembly banned the sale and manufacture of fireworks in this state, according to results of a survey made by the Hospital Care association. During the Christmas season of 1948, the survey showed, physicians treated 106 patients injured by firecrackers of fireworks, while two years before the figure was 751.
The survey showed two treated in Franklin in 1946 for injuries, while none was treated last Christmas.
