**NOTICE OF SPECIAL BOND ELECTION TO BE HELD ON JUNE 4, 1949, ON THE ISSUANCE OF TWO HUNDRED MILLION DOLLARS STATE SECONDARY ROAD BONDS, AND TWENTY-FIVE MILLION DOLLARS STATE SCHOOL PLANT CONSTRUCTION AND REPAIR BONDS.**
