4 OUT OF 100 EXAMINEES HAVE CANCER

Growing Number Going To Clinics Shows Public Interest

Up to this time, 4.3 per cent of those examined in the six cancer diagnostic centers operated by the North Carolina State Board of Health have been found to have cancer, figures just compiled reveal.
One of the six centers, serving this end of the state, is situated at the C. J. Harris Community hospital, Sylva.
The number being examined at the various clinics is said to be constantly growing, indicating that the public is becoming aware of the importance of early detection of cancer, since it is in its early stages that it is curable.
Free clinics are held weekly, the one at Sylva on Fridays. No clinic will be held there Friday (tomorrow), however, since that day falls two days before Christmas, and the State Board of Health has designated it as a holiday for health workers throughout the state.
