

Do You Know Your Auto Tag Numbers? It's No Accident That Governor Scott's Is No. 1

Do you know your alphabet from B to Z? That's the range of alphabetical prefixes used for the more than a million motor-vehicle license tags to be issued in this state for 1951.

None of the letters is new this year, although several were used last year for the first time. When the registration figure passed the million mark last year, the W came into use on plates for passenger cars, since only six numerals will go on the standard size plate. R was used when the 1,100,000 mark was passed. The Z is another year-old letter. It is used on all passenger car trailers, P, standing for public-owned, has been used for a number of years; however, for the first time last year the silver tags with black letters and numerals were issued to between 20,000 and 25,000 public cars and trucks for the life of the vehicles.

The National Guard tag is a revival of a prewar custom. Special plates went to guard officers in 1937, and were discontinued when the war began. Approximately 720 were in use during 1950.

Some of the old letters are B or bus for hire, S for contract carrier truck, F for common carrier truck, EX for common carrier trailer, K for contract carrier, J for the Supreme Court justices, H for the highway commission, M for manufacturer and T for passenger for

hire. Several factors, such as rank, protocol and seniority, enter into the issuance of the low-numbered official plates.

As in the past, Gov. W. Kerr Scott takes No. 1 and Lt. Gov. H. Pat Taylor, of Wadesboro, No. 2. The Speaker of the House always is assigned No. 3.

Frankfurter Roll-ups

Broadcast: April 14, 1951

1 cup diced American Cheese
1/2 cup Fat Milk
8 tablespoons well-drained pickle relish

Put cheese and milk in top of double boiler. Cook and stir over boiling water until cheese melts. Remove from heat; then fold in pickle relish. Cover; let stand until thick. Turn on oven; set at moderate (375). Remove crusts from bread. Spread with cheese mixture. Cut frankfurters lengthwise into halves. Put a frankfurter-half diagonally across center of each bread slice. Fold opposite corners of bread over frankfurters; fasten with tooth-picks. Put on greased baking sheet. Bake 10 min., or until thoroughly heated. Serve hot. Makes 4 servings.
