(4) Schools, institutions of an educational or philanthropic nature, public buildings (5) churches, convents (6) hospitals, clinics (7) museums, art galleries, libraries, parks, playgrounds, not conducted for profit (8) farming, truck gardening, nurseries, (9) accessory buildings including one private garage when located not less than 25 feet from the front line of the lot or as a part of the main building, and also including one private stable, unless otherwise prohibited, when located not less than 60 feet from the front line of the lot and not less than eight feet from any other lot line.

Height regulations—no building shall be erected or structurally altered to exceed 35 feet in height.

Area regulations—front yards shall have a depth of not less than 20 feet; side yards on every residential lot shall number two, each not less than eight feet in width and the two combined not less than 20 feet. This applies to all lots, including corner lots, except a reverse corner lot facing an intersection.

Business: All types of business, except those which may be obnoxious or offensive by reason of emission of odor, dust, smoke, gas, or noise.

Height regulations: Any building erected above 50 feet in height, shall be set back from the front lot line on the ratio of one foot for each two feet rise in the building over 50 feet, but in no case shall the required set-back exceed 10 feet.

Area regulations: No side yard is required in the business district except those erected for dwelling purposes, or where a building abuts on a residential area.

Industrial: In the industrial district, buildings and land may be used for any purpose not in conflict with any ordinance of the Town of Franklin.

Area regulations: Neither front or side yards shall be required, unless buildings are erected for dwelling purposes, or abut on a residential area.

With the passage of the ordinance by the board of aldermen, a board of adjustment is automatically established. It will consist of five members, citizens of Franklin, appointed by the mayor and approved by the board of aldermen. Each member will serve three years, with the exception of the first five appointed, who will serve respectively for terms of one year, two years, and three years; thereafter members will serve three years.
