No bid of less than \$9,310.96 as a lump sum payment will be considered. In addition to the price bid for stumpage a total deposit of \$430.52 will be required for sale area betterment work. 2 Macon Soldiers Participate In Army Exercises

Two Macon County soldiers were among the more than 30,000 men taking part in "Exercise Snowfall", the joint army-air force winter maneuver, which ended last week at Camp Drum, N. Y., the Army Home Town news center has announced.

The local soldiers were identified as Pfc. Bobby L. Potts, son of Mr. and Mrs. Troy L. Potts, of Franklin, and Cpl. Robert L. Campbell, of Franklin, Route 3.

Pfc. Potts is a member of the 11th Airborne division's 511th regiment, a highly-trained unit which took part in last summer's "Exercise Southern Pines" in this state. Prior to entering the army in January, 1951, he attended Franklin High school. He was graduated from the Fort Benning, Ga., parachute school in April, 1951.

Cpl. Campbell also is a member of the 511th regiment, and is connected with the ammunition and reconnaissance platoon of the 3rd Battalion's headquarters company. He entered service in June, 1950, and was graduated from parachute school at Fort Benning in November, 1950.
