Macon Native Succumbs After Short Illness In Local Hospital

James Newton Rogers, a Macon County native, died June 10 in a local hospital after a short illness. He was 78 years old.

Funeral services were conducted the following afternoon at 2:30 o'clock at the Ellijay Baptist church by the Rev. Frank Reed. Burial was in the church cemetery.

A farmer, Mr. Rogers was born April 9, 1874, the son of Dave and Mrs. Angeline Mincey Rogers, of the Ellijay community.

He was a member of the Pine Grove Baptist church and was married in 1901 to Miss Millie Peek, who died in 1932. For the past several years he had been living with his son, Fred Rogers, in the Cullasaja community.
