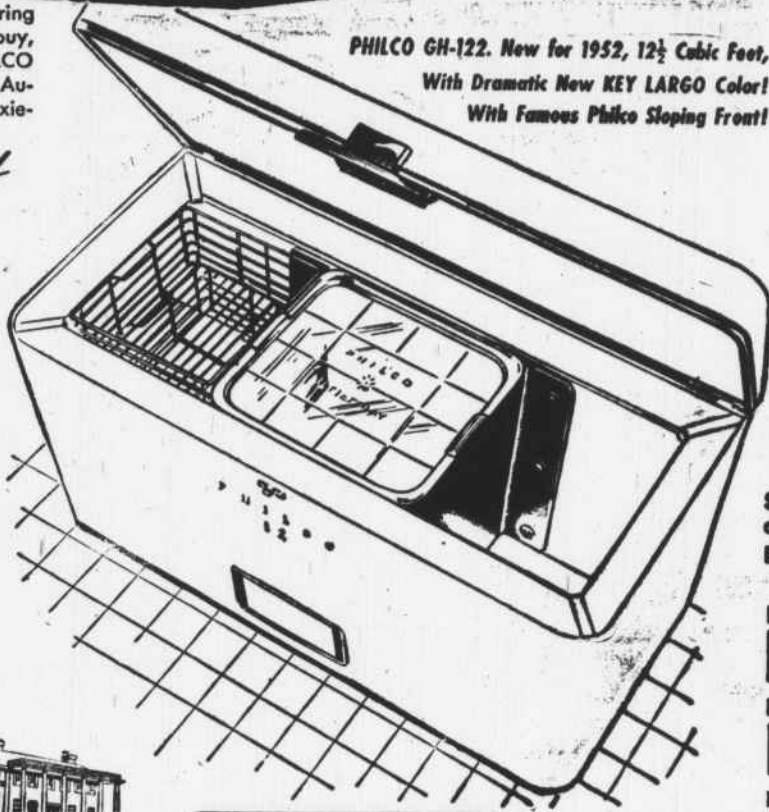

difficult in the mountains. But I decided our troubles are not very serious when I noted one bridge down on the coast that is three miles long; and again when, in order to save a lot of miles driving around sounds, we ferried across two six-mile stretches. Those big ferries, operated by the State Highway commission, haul a score or more of automobiles and trucks at a time—and take something like an hour to cross six miles of water.

Here are a few other impressions:

As remarkable as the scenery and engineering on the Blue Ridge Parkway are the absence of advertising signs and the fact there is NO TRASH. Whether the road is patrolled by men who pick up the paper and other trash of motorists or whether people just won't litter up something that is clean, I never saw so much as a chewing gum paper.

If it is that people hesitate to spoil something clean and beautiful, it might be a good idea to get Franklin spotlessly clean for once.

The State Highway commission has done a superb job of marking the highways. Placed at just the right distances from intersections, the highway numbers are to be found everywhere they are needed. Given a good road map, there is little excuse for anybody to get lost in North Carolina.

And so well are the roads marked to warn of curves and other hazards, there seems little excuse for motor accidents.

Small and middle-sized towns in Eastern North Carolina lack the beauty of scenery with which towns in this region are blessed, but many of those in the east have MADE themselves beautiful by planting and caring for their trees. The towns with tree-shaded streets are the ones we remembered when we got back home.

The historical drama, "The Lost Colony", at Manteo, now about 15 years old, is so good it makes those at Cherokee and Boone seem a bit amateurish. But the setting cannot even touch that at Cherokee!

A trip from Macon to Manteo leaves no doubt in the motorist's mind that North Carolina really is "the variety" state. It is like going from one world into another.

If we, in the mountains, think we have progressed agriculturally, a trip down east will keep us from being too smug about it.

Expecting nothing but cotton and tobacco, I was amazed at the miles of beautiful corn, and hundreds of acres planted to what appeared to be cow peas.

Reference has been made in this column to unusual Macon County expressions, among them the use of the word "evening" for that period between noon and dark. I had thought it a strictly mountain expression. But I heard it, of all places! in quaint, old Plymouth, in the far east. It evidently was brought over from England.

And so, different as the easterners seem from us, we probably are all distant cousins.
