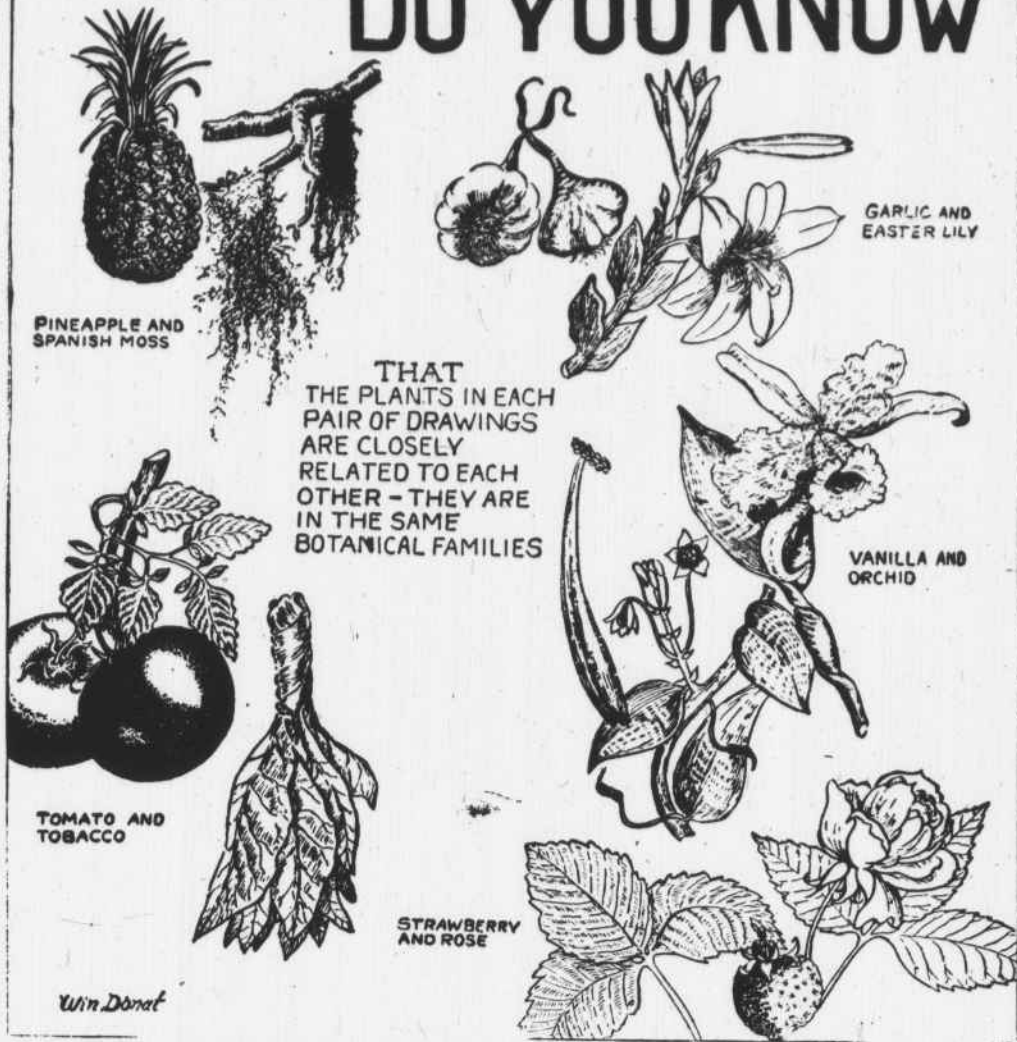

The Rev. Robert Miller Hart has begun his duties as new pastor of the Highlands Presbyterian church.

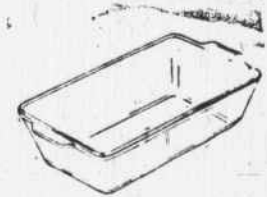

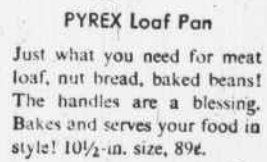

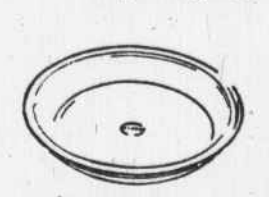
