State College Answers Timely Farm Questions

Q. How can I prevent weed flavors in milk?

A. The best solution appears to be in eliminating such annual weeds as bitterweed, garlic and other forms of onions, by the development and use of better pastures and crops, according to L. W. Aurand, of the department of animal industry at N. C. State college.

Mr. Aurand also notes that such feeds as clover, lucerne cabbages, etc. also give characteristic flavors to milk when fed just before milking. Several months for the removal of offflavors have been studied but none give promise of providing a general solution to the offflavor problem.
