During April, the State Highway Commission completed 1.1 miles of surfacing in Macon County, the 10th division has reported.

Two roads graded, drained, and surfaced with trafficbound macadam were Dills and Allen Road, for 0.3 mile, and Bates Branch Road for 0.3 mile.

St. John Church Road, for 0.2 mile, Rickman Creek Road, for 0.1 mile, and Felsty Branch Road, 0.2, were stabilized and their existing surfaces strengthened with trafficbound macadam.

A total of 5.4 miles of road work was brought to completion in the division during the month, the announcement said.
