

**State College Answers
Timely Farm Questions**

Q. Will stacked pulpwood tend to increase the number of beetles in my standing timber?
A. The cut wood stacked and remaining in the same general area with standing timber may afford a breeding place for beetles. These insects could do considerable damage to your standing timber. Best bet would be to get the stacked pulpwood out of the timber stand.

Q. How can I get rid of a

weed in my lawn that has prickly spines?
A. What you speak of is probably soliva sessilis, a weed that blooms early in the spring and later develops spines or thorns that become uncomfortable to the bare feet. Applications of 2, 4-D at the rate of three quarters pound per acre during the early blooming state should control the pest.

Q. How can I stop birds from eating my grapes?
A. There is no known repellent. You can shoot them, but more will come to take their place. Your best bet is to cover the grape arbor entirely with a fine mesh cloth, such as mos-

quito netting. In the event that Blue Jays are your worst offenders, you may find some element of success in shooting several and hanging their carcasses on or near the arbor. But this is not effective in the case of song birds.

Good Housekeeping Habits

Cellophane should be removed from lamp shades before using them because the heat from the bulb shrinks the cellophane and tends to pull the shade out of shape—cellophane is used only to protect shade from wear and tear in the shop.
A cloth moistened with vinegar will whiten piano keys.
To prevent mattresses from picking up rust marks from the springs, give the springs a coat of paint when the original paint shows signs of wearing thin.
When repairing furniture requiring a slender nail, try gripping the nail in a spring paper clip until it is well started.
Dust hangs downward, so

when you clean walls brush in an upward motion to prevent smearing and streaking.
Keep parchment shades clean by waxing them; it will make them easy to dust and add a soft luster to the finish.
Wall plaster will not crack so easily if a small piece of adhesive or cellophane tape is passed over the spot where a tack or nail is to be driven.
Immediately after polishing a brass or metal door knocker, wax it to keep it looking bright longer.
To remove white rings left by hot dishes, place a few drops of camphorated oil or sweet oil on the ring, let soak in a few minutes, then polish with a soft cloth.

"The Gospel of Christ"
Rom. 1:16; I Cor. 9:18; II Cor. 4:4
Subject:
"Can a Person be Saved Outside The Church?"—II

We believe that the above question was answered very fully in the negative in our last lesson. But there is more Bible proof available, so that we will apply ourselves. Please re-read the lesson of last week. Now to our fourth point.
4. THE CHURCH IS THAT WHICH CHRIST PURCHASED WITH HIS BLOOD. "Take heed unto yourselves, and to all the flock, in which the Holy Spirit hath made you bishops (overseers), to feed the church of the Lord which he purchased with his own blood." Acts 20:28. We see that the price paid for the church was the blood of Christ. Can such an institution be a non-essential one? Can it be that one can be saved out of such an institution just as well as in it? If so, why then did Christ die? The blood of Christ is IN the church. That is where he put it. To say that a man can be saved outside the church is to say that he can be saved without the blood of Christ. Why? Because the blood of Christ is in the church. If a person asked you how much you have in your car, you would understand him to mean how much do you have invested in it—what did it cost. The purchase price of the church was the blood of the Son of God. But someone will say, "Christ died so that we could be saved." Exactly. But whom is he going to save by that death? Will he save the rebel? Will he save the infidel? Obviously not. Who then will benefit from the death of Christ? "He that doeth the will of my Father who is in heaven." Matt. 7:21. By obeying the gospel we are doing the will of the Father, but in doing so we become members of the church. This was the way that the people on Pentecost benefited from the blood of Christ. "They then that received his word were baptized; and there were added unto them in that day about three thousand souls." Acts 2:41. For a man to come into the church (where the blood of Christ is) he must receive the word and be baptized just as these people did. The receiving of the word included the repentance of one who had already believed. Acts 2:37,38. In this way we will benefit from the atoning blood of Christ. But to say that we can be saved out of the church is to say that we can be saved without the blood of Christ.
5. TO BE IN THE CHURCH IS TO BE IN CHRIST. The very act which places a person in Christ places him in the body of the church. "For as many of you as were baptized into Christ did put on Christ." Gal. 3:27. Here the apostle says that we are "baptized into Christ." In I Cor. 12:13 we see, "For by one Spirit were we all baptized into one body." So then the act that places a person in Christ places him in the body. It is impossible to conceive of being in Christ and not being in the church. To say that one can be saved outside the church is to say that one can be saved out of Christ. It would also follow then that he could be saved without becoming a new creature. "Wherefore if any man is in Christ, he is a new creature." 2 Cor. 5:17. Where are we new creatures? In Christ. Obviously a man cannot be saved in his old state of sin. He must become a new creature—a new person. This is not done out of Christ, for Paul says that we are new creatures "in Christ."

To go a little further, a person out of Christ has not had his sins forgiven, for Paul again says that we have been translated into the kingdom of the Son of his love, "in whom (that is, in Christ) we have our redemption, the forgiveness of our sins." Col. 1:13,14. So one who is not in Christ is one who has not been redeemed—he has not been forgiven. Let's remember, though, to be in Christ is to be in the body; to be in the body is to be in the church. To say that a person can be saved outside the Lord's church is to say that he can be saved without having his sins forgiven, and without being redeemed. In 2 Tim. 2:10 Paul says, "Therefore I endure all things for the elect's sake, that they also may obtain the salvation which is IN Christ Jesus with eternal glory." This does not say that the church saves, but that the saved are in the church. That is, the saved are in Christ. To say then that a person can be saved outside the church is to make the statement that he can be saved without salvation, for salvation is in Christ—just another way of saying in the church. How inconsistent it is for a person to know that the church is a subject of prophecy both in the Old and New Testaments. Eph. 3:9-11; the institution was purchased with the blood of Christ Acts 20:28; called the Lord's body Eph. 1:22,23; God's family I Tim. 3:15; and Christ's kingdom. Col. 1:12,13, and then say, "I think a person can be saved out of it just as well as in it."
