Hot Spiced Grape Juice

juice of 1 lemon
1 quart of grape juice (canned or frozen)
2 cups boiling water
½ cup sugar
2 nutmegs (cracked)
1½ sticks cinnamon
4 pieces orange rind.

Cut the orange rind in small pieces (free from white inner skin). Heat all ingredients together and simmer for 10 minutes. Strain and serve hot.

Serve with the hot grape juice cheese straws or several kinds of your favorite cookies.

For a festive holiday touch, float a lemon slice in each cup and top it with a red cherry and a small leaf of holly. This deep red punch is unique in its flavor and will keep conversation flowing smoothly as the guests try to name its ingredients.
