Horse Cove, is chief horticulturist in charge of the nurseries for the U. S. Naval Corps on the East Coast.

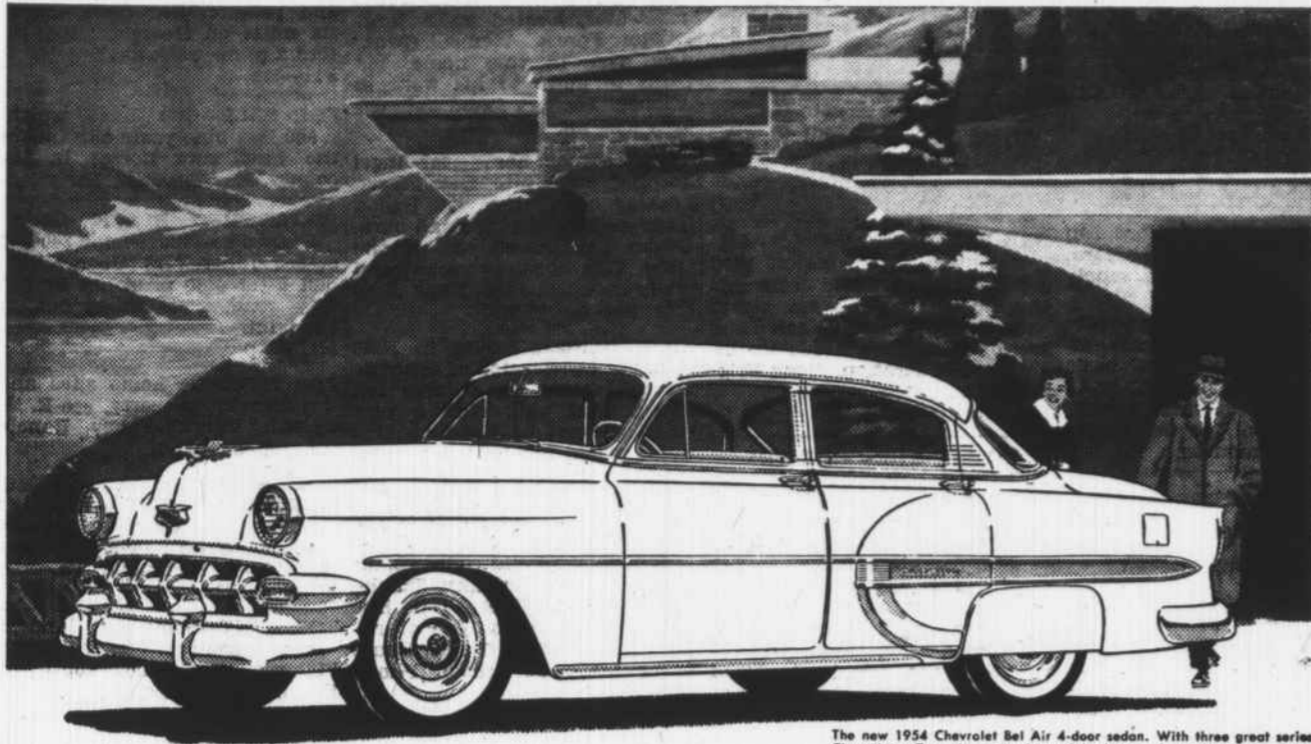
His headquarters are at Camp LeJeune. During the past two years he has had several im-

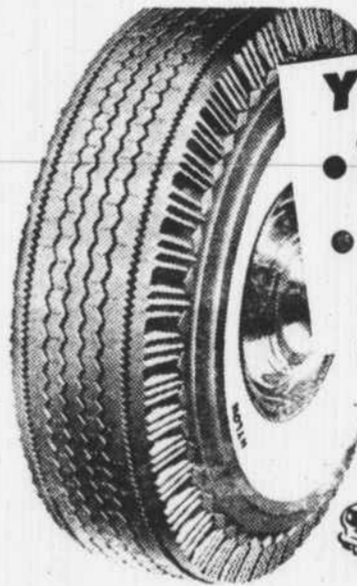
