Q. Can I carry back and carforward net operating losses

A. With lower farm prices and two dry years, many farmers have come up with a net operating loss at the end of the year. If you show a net loss on your return for the current year because of unprofitable farm operations, you can use this business loss to offset income in other years provided you do not have additional income during the year from other sources offsetting your farm loss.
