C., up to and not later than 2:00 p. m., April 26, 1954, and opened immediately thereafter for all the timber marked for cutting, located on an area embracing about 60 acres on Jarrett Creek, a tributary of the Nantahala River, Macon County, Nantahala National Forest, N. C., in the total number of 474 hardwood trees. No bid of less than \$2,100.00 as a lump sum payment will be considered. In addition to the amount bid for stumpage, a total deposit of \$350.00 will be required for sale area betterment work.
