The Highlands Garden Club met last Thursday at the Flat Mountain home of the president, Mrs. A. T. Carter. As this was an open meeting on landscaping, members invited friends to hear the guest speakers, David Watson and James Carey, both of Clemson College, S. C.

Mr. Watson spoke of the infinite variety of landscaping to be found in mountain and hillside gardens, of the inspiring vistas that could be opened up here. He pointed out that all gardens should have a focal point. Mr. Watson paid tribute to the pioneering work of the late Prof. Thomas Grant Harbison who, while working with the Arnold Arboretum of Harvard University, discovered a hitherto unknown small flowered purple rhododendron. This rhododendron is now known as Rhododendron Harbisoni.

He also spoke of the work being done by Henry Wright, who has an outstanding collection
