**Macon Schools 10th In Value
In State; Lead In This Area**

Macon ranks 10th among North Carolina's 19 mountain counties in value of school buildings.

This is shown by figures compiled by North Carolina School Facts, publication of the state department of public instruction.

This county, with 14 buildings (11 schools) valued at \$1,535,245, leads in southwestern North Carolina.

In the entire mountain area, it is surpassed in value of school buildings by Buncombe, Burke, Haywood, Henderson, Madison, McDowell, Mitchell, Rutherford, and Transylvania.

The comparative figures for the other counties in this immediate area are:

Cherokee, \$1,315,278; Clay, \$436,050; Graham, \$509,500; Jackson, \$1,104,073; and Swain, \$991,200.

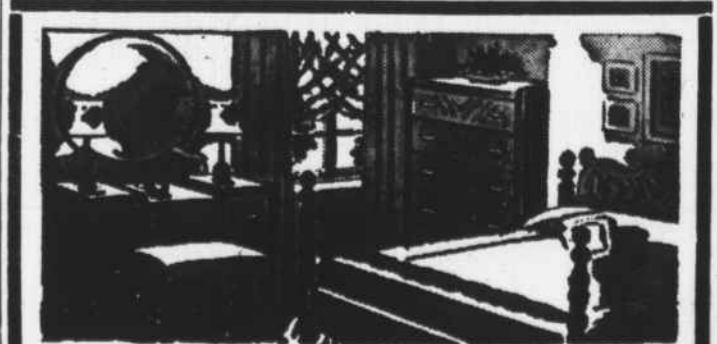
