SCHOLARSHIP LOAN READY

Mendenhall Fund Available At State For Local Student

A scholarship loan for a Macon student at N. C. State College is now available through the trustees of the S. W. Mendenhall memorial fund.

At a meeting last Thursday, the trustees voted to make \$381.56 available for some needy student. The remainder of the memorial fund, \$375, has been invested in a \$500 Saving Bond.

Under the terms of the scholarship loan, an applicant must be a high school graduate, a resident of the county, and must provide three references. The loan must be repaid to the trustees within two years after the graduation of the borrower.

Trustees for the memorial fund, which was established earlier in the year following the death of County Agent S. W. Mendenhall, include Mrs. Mendenhall, Holland McSwain, and T. H. Fagg.

Scholarship applicants may obtain additional information from any of the three trustees.
