Court Closes Down; Cases Are Listed

Judge Walter E. Johnston, Jr., unofficially shut down the December term of Superior Court here Wednesday of last week after disposing of the criminal docket in two and a half days.

The light 12-case civil docket — scheduled to be taken up Thursday — was dispatched at odd moments during criminal proceedings. Five divorces were granted and the remaining cases were continued to the April term.

Unless something new develops, the court term will die a legal death Saturday. Under the law, the term has only recessed and will be active until then. However, Judge Johnston has returned to his home in Winston-Salem.
