

Panthers Split Cage Duel With Sylva; Beat Indians

Franklin High's basketballers split their season opener with Sylva High on December 8—the boys losing and the girls winning—but rolled to a twin win over Cherokee Friday night.

The girls, defending champions of the Smoky Mountain Conference, were in top form as they swamped Sylva 59 to 29. And they kept on the move in defeating Cherokee 53 to 29.

After leading at the half, the Franklin lads dropped the opener with Sylva, 49 to 40. In the Cherokee clash they came out with a 36 to 29 victory.

In the Sylva game, Jodie Lenior dumped in 10 points in the opening stanza as the Panthers jumped ahead 20 to 6 and were never challenged. Coach Howard Barnwell cleared the bench, using 22 players. Lenior took the high scoring honors with 17 points, followed by Audrey Gibson with 15.

In the Cherokee game the girls found the going tough during the first three periods, but outscored the Indians by 19 points in the final stanza to capture a 53 to 29 victory. Again it was Lenior and Gibson in the scoring department with 25 and 20 points, respectively.

Against Sylva, the Franklin boys put up a game fight, but after leading 22 to 20 at the half, fell to a third period Sylva rally and lost 49 to 40. Bobby Jack Love led the locals in scoring, hitting for 10 points, while Crawford Moore, Bill Mendenhall, and Johnny Tippett made eight each.

In the Cherokee scrap, Coach T. J. Edwards didn't use a single substitute. The panthers led throughout the game, but never by more than 10 points. Willard Smith provided the main scoring punch as he tallied 12 points.
