**Timely Farm Questions • State College Answers**

Question: How long must I allow my cow to be dry between calving?

Answer: A cow should have a six to eight week's dry period. If this rule is followed a stronger, more vigorous calf will be dropped, and on the average cows having a 50 to 60 day dry period produced 1,000 pounds more milk than those dry less than 30 days.

Question: What has caused the price of broilers to drop so drastically?

Answer: The present broiler situation was brought about by an increased supply of marketable broilers. It is estimated that there are over a million broilers of marketable size in North Carolina. As an indication of the increase, only 4,400,000 broilers were produced in 1940 compared to 50,738,000 in 1953.

Question: How often should queen bees be replaced with new ones?

Answer: Re-queening at least every two years is the most effective.
