THE COOKING CORNER
Favorite Recipes
OF MACON WOMEN

SUGAR COOKIES

Mix thoroughly—
½ cup soft shortening (half butter)
¾ cup sugar
1 egg
Stir in—
1 tbs. milk or cream
1 tsp. flavoring (vanilla or lemon or a combination of the two)
Sift together and stir in—
1½ cups sifted flour
¼ tsp. baking powder
¼ tsp. salt
Chill dough. Roll very thin (1/16"). Cut into desired shapes. Place on lightly greased baking sheet, and sprinkle with sugar. Bake until delicately browned. Temperature: 425° (hot oven). Time: Bake 5 to 7 min. Amount: About 5 dozen 2½" cookies.
