



soft shortening ½ cup

1 egg

1 tbsp. milk or cream 1 tsp. flavoring (vanilla or lemon

1¼ cups sifted flour ¼ tsp. baking powder 1/4 tsp. salt

Chill dough. Roll very thin (1/16"). Cut into desired shapes. Place on lightly greased baking sheet, and sprinkle with sugar. Bake until delicately browned. Temperature: 425° (hot oven)
Time: Bake 5 to 7 min.
Amount: About 5 dozen 2½"
