**This Week With Macon County Agents**

Sheep can be a source of increased income to the average farmer of Macon County. This is true particularly on farms where surpluses of good legume hay and pasture are produced. Sheep have the ability to utilize pasture and roughage better than any other type animal. They afford two sources of income through the sale of lambs and wool. The labor, feed, and equipment required to take care of sheep is very small as compared with other classes of livestock.

Since farm income is getting to be quite a problem with our farmers, they might well consider this enterprise as an addition to their farming operation. I do not think it advisable to go into the sheep business, or any other farming operation, too heavily to start off with, but rather on a small scale of, say 10 to 15 ewes, until experience is gained. Then, if successful, expand the operation as desired.

The following are some figures of what 195 demonstration farmers owning 4,226 ewes in 16 North Carolina Counties did:

- Average yearly cost of keeping ewes, \$4.70.
  - Pounds of wool per ewe, 7.
  - Average income from wool per ewe, \$4.72.
  - Per cent lamb crop, 104.
  - Average income per lamb, \$24.33.
  - Total income lambs and wool per ewe, \$29.05.
  - Average net income ewe, \$24.35.
- Very few other farming enterprises will return as great a net income per dollar invested as this.
- An excellent source with which to start a small flock is Western-bred yearling ewes. These are primarily grade Rambouillet—Hampshire ewes and have proven very successful in this section of the state when crossed with purebred Hampshire rams. They have excellent bodies and fleeces and produce top quality market lambs. Farmers wishing to secure these Western-bred ewes should contact the county agent's office before March 31. These ewes will probably cost somewhere in the neighborhood of \$25 per head.
