Had Poor Vision

Eye-witnesses to the accident which claimed Mr. Ledford's life, told Patrolman Ferguson he walked into the path of the

automobile. Jess L. and D. L. Rogers, both of Franklin, Route 2, were traveling toward Franklin about 7:25, saw the impending accident and pulled to the side of the highway and stopped, the officer reported. They said Mr. Ledford hesitated about the middle of the highway and then continued crossing. Patrolman Ferguson said a member of the family said Mr. Ledford was unable to see more than about 50 feet and he "crossed (the highway) by sound".

The critically injured man was rushed to Angel Hospital following the accident. He died about 1 p. m.

Not To Blame

If he introduces such a bill, Mr. Houk said, it must provide for a vote of the people of the township.

Since title to the hospital is in a board of trustees, rather than a public body, there is a question, the Macon legislator said, whether it is possible to draw a bill that will be constitutional. It might be necessary to transfer ownership to the Town of Highlands or Highlands township for such a tax, even if approved in an election, to be legal.

He will present the problem to the attorney general, Mr. Houk said, and introduce such a bill, providing for a township vote, if the attorney general thinks it will stand up in the courts.

Mr. Houk revealed that, on two separate occasions, he voted against the milk bill, "for the reason I am opposed to any kind of price fixing". The measure, stripped of its most controversial features, finally was passed.

Mr. Houk said he thinks this county needs little or no local legislation, and that he is devoting his attention to statewide issues.

The Macon representative is serving on 11 house committees. The seven more important ones are those on appropriations, education, judiciary (No. 1), propositions and grievances, salaries and fees, courts and judicial districts, and senatorial districts.

Signed, Sealed But Not Delivered



ONE of the oddest historical mementos in Bermuda is the seal press of the Great Seal of the Confederacy which now belongs to a Bermudian named Ernest Darrell. Ordered by Jefferson Davis, president of the Confederate States, the seal and its press were shipped to mid-Atlantic Bermuda, now a famed resort, for trans shipment to Wilmington, N. C. However, the original press, a bulky iron affair prettily decorated with flower engravings, could not be smuggled through the blockade so it was left in the care of the Confederate consul and later sold at auction. An exact replica of the seal is now with the press, although the whereabouts of the original is not known. It is hoped to secure the press and its duplicate seal for public exhibition in Bermuda. FNS
