

### Ore Drilling Program Set By Company

R. G. Lichtenstein, president of the Carolina Resources Corporation here, has announced that his company will begin its diamond

drilling program to test the depth of vermiculite ore bodies at its Main Line mine. Core drilling will get under way immediately, he said, and will require about 30 days to complete. Mr. Lichtenstein also announced that the Bidwell Drift, at the company's Corundum Hill mine, is being reopened to speed exploratory and development work. In years past, the Bidwell Drift has produced substantial amounts of

corundum, he noted, and commercial production of corundum is the purpose of the present development work.

No corundum is presently being produced in the United States, Mr. Lichtenstein said.
