



holes; have chimneys repaired where mortar or bricks are loose, and replace pipes if necessary. Dirty and defective chimneys are a leading cause of fires.

**State College Answers Timely Farm Questions**

**Q. What causes rancid milk?**  
**A.** Rancid milk is usually associated with cows that have been in milk for a long time. It may come from a cow that is too thin or it may be a herd problem caused by feeding very poor quality roughage without any green feed in the diet. Recent studies in a Western state also indicate that rancidity may sometimes be traced to faulty pipe-line milkers.  
**Q. In raising earthworms, how many worms should I put in a regulation-sized box?**  
**A.** The number of worms should be limited to 500 to 600 per box. The worms tend to limit their population to correspond to the available food.  
**Q. What is the most important factor in determining the nicotine content in tobacco?**  
**A.** Moisture supply. The more moisture during the growing season, the lower the nicotine content.  
**Q. How deep should I put fertilizer in my vegetable garden?**  
**A.** When fertilizer is applied as deep as the soil is spaded or plowed, it encourages plant roots to develop well below the surface where greater moisture can be obtained. This method is particularly effective for commercial fertilizers.  
**Q. What can I do to control poison ivy in my orchard?**  
**A.** Studies show that when proper caution is used, certain chemicals may be used without serious injury to trees and fruit. Two

protective containers clean—if made of fabric, suds them; if plastic, swab them down with soap and water.  
**Let's Clean—up.** Clear out chemicals, ammonium sulfamate at one pound per gallon of water, end the low volatile esters of 2,4,5-T at 2,000 p.p.m. in water, were both very effective in killing ivy when applied around the middle of July.  
**Q. What is a good treatment for oat smut and barley stripe?**  
**A.** A new chemical, Panogen, is recommended this year for the first time in North Carolina. In tests, the new treatment gave complete control. Two other chemicals now recommended also give complete control.

paint and oil rags; destroy rags or keep in closed metal container; hang up mops and paint-soiled clothing so air can circulate around them. Paint or oil-soaked rags heat up from chemical action, burst into flames. Clean up after painting jobs.

Check your fuses: Use 15 ampere fuses in regular household circuits. Don't make emergency repairs to fuses; keep wiring in good repair; have all work done by an expert electrician. Fuses protect your appliances, your house and your family from damage and possible fire when wires are overloaded or a short circuit occurs.

Flammable liquids: Hundreds of persons are killed annually trying to clean with gasoline, benzene or naphtha. (Do not use highly flammable or explosive fluids for dry cleaning.)

Check pipes and chimneys: Clean soot out of chimneys and smokepipes. Check for cracks and
