

This Week With Macon County Agents

Mrs. Ralph Bradley, county health leader of the 24 home

demonstration clubs, has set the good example in her own community of Oak Grove of what can be done in a health project. Mrs. Bradley attended a district health meeting two years ago before the chest X-ray mobile unit came to Macon County. She returned to her community and with the help of the club members divided Oak Grove into sections that every family was contacted about the free X-ray. As a result, all members of Oak Grove Club came to the mobile unit and

the club members believe that at least 90 per cent of the adults in the community also had the X-ray. The Oak Grove women not only contacted their neighbors, they offered transportation if it was needed. Mrs. Bradley was glad to work with the local public health nurse, Mrs. Mae Shope, in planning a demonstration, "Your Health," for the month of April. Mrs. Shope requested the film, "You Can Help," to be shown to over 500 club women. The film told the story of the National Tuberculosis Association and what has been done through the years to bring the white plague from first place as a killer to fourth place along with other communicable diseases.

Rural women believe that preventive medicine is the best medicine and that is the reason that Macon County has the record of many adults going to the Cancer Detection Clinic at Sylva. The women tell their neighbors that the clinic is located in the basement of the C. J. Harris Hospital; that it is open each Friday from 9 to 10:15 for registration; that

the examination is free; and that every woman over 35 should be screened in the clinic.

"Man Alive" is a 10-minute film the club women have seen with fear and what a simple fear can do in a person's life. Homemakers realize that beautiful homes, modern conveniences, education and other facilities are an enjoyment of life, but are of little value to people unless they are well. So they are using all available health resources. When the chest X-ray mobile unit comes to Macon County it will be the concern of the homemakers to be their "Brother's Keepers" in encouraging every adult in Macon County to come for the X-ray. All through the year, and not just through April, when the funds are being raised by the American Cancer Society, the women are saying, "Have you been for your examination at the detection clinic?" "Don't be fearful, but be careful" is a good slogan for any day in the year, for any family member.

Plyler Heads New Rifle Club

National Forest Timber For Sale

Sealed bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor, U. S. Forest Service, P. O. Box 731, Asheville, N. C., up to and not later than 2:00 p.m., May 31, 1955 and opened immediately thereafter for all the timber marked for cutting, located on an area embracing about 2120 acres on Jones Creek, a tributary of the Little Tennessee River, Macon County, Nantahala National Forest, N. C., in the total number of 8148 hardwood trees. No bid of less than \$46,675.00 as a lump sum payment will be considered. In addition to the amount bid for stumpage, a total deposit of \$5,325.00 will be required for sale area betterment work. In addition to the above amounts any unmarked timber which is authorized for cutting in connection with road construction or other improvements, or which is otherwise cut and subject to payment, will be paid for at the following rates for stumpage: \$35.00 per MBF for ash, black cherry, cucumber, Northern red oak, yellow poplar; \$22.00 per MBF for basswood, red maple, sugar maple, white oak; \$13.00 per MBF for black oak, chestnut oak; \$8.00 per MBF for birch; \$3.00 per MBF for beech, butternut, chestnut, scarlet oak; and \$2.00 per MBF for buckeye, black gum, hickory. \$5000.00 must be deposited with each bid to be applied on the purchase price, refunded, or retained in part as liquidated damages, according to conditions of sale. The purchaser will be responsible for the maintenance or for his share of the maintenance of Forest Service Roads used in hauling of timber and/or timber products removed from the sale area. Picture the Colors of Spring in Color

This is the time of year when most of us welcome color back to the world around us. Fresh green foliage, blossoms in lovely pastel bouquets, soft blue skies, newly-turned rich earth, mauve-pink twilight—the children in candy-colored chambray, Mother in gay new prints—the spring scene abounds in color for your camera to catch.

Everyone will agree that color adds its own magic to almost any subject—and happily for us full-color film is available for every type of camera. No longer can it be considered a luxury item, limited to owners of more elaborate cameras. With a simple box-type camera you can take beautiful true-to-life color snapshots. These are handsome snapshots to brighten up your album or have on hand in your wallet for a quick proud glance whenever you feel like it.

When you are color-shooting with a box-type camera, you'll want to be more careful than usual about the sunniness of the day. You'll find that the best color quality is obtained outdoors in bright or hazy sunlight, with shadows kept soft yet full of detail. Your best effect will come from soft lighting—behind you and full on the subject—without the strong contrasts of light and shade that make for deep harsh shadows. Let the contrasts of color take the place of contrasting light and shade, and look for simple backgrounds, preferably in cool colors like blue and green. Also, remember that your best time for shooting is after the sun has been up for several hours or in the mid-afternoon about two hours before sunset.

With these few words to the wise, why don't you shoot in color this spring? Try it, and you'll be glad it's no longer B.C.—Before color film!
