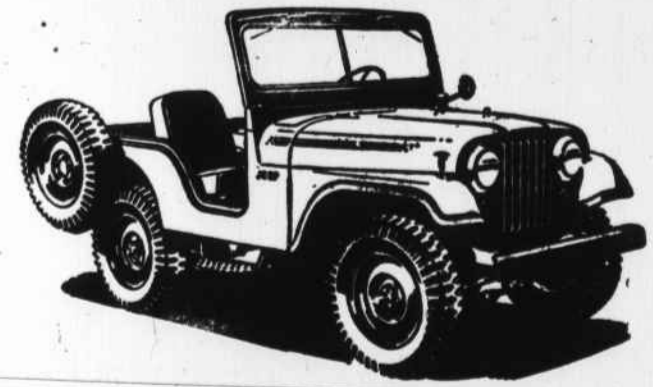

SAUERKRAUT Pack sterilized quart jars to within 3/4 inch of top of jar with finely chopped cabbage. Add 2 level teaspoons salt. Fill to overflowing with boiling water. Seal with rubber and top. If it works out a little in a few days, no harm is done. After 2 or 3 days, wrap jars in paper or put them in paper bags and place in basement or cool place. This keeps kraut white and crisp. Mrs. J.
