What's New At Franklin High

Monday will mark the beginning of the annual United Funds Drive at Franklin School. Sponsored by the Student Council, a total of \$400 to \$500 in student contributions is expected at Franklin High and Franklin Elementary.

Six charitable organizations will share in the proceeds of the drive. The March of Dimes will receive 37 1/2%, and the American Heart Fund, Junior Red Cross, Easter Seals, American Cancer Society, and Christmas Seals will each receive 12 1/2%.

Last year a total of \$400.84 was taken in. High school contributions totaled \$171.78; the remainder was given in the elementary school.

A "thermometer" showing total amount of contributions each day will be posted on the bulletin board in the F. H. S. lobby. Another chart will show the progress of the different home rooms. The drive will probably end Friday.

No organizations conduct their own fund-raising campaigns here. Students may not solicit donations from others; only personal donations are permitted.

Seniors are pushing their fund-raising activities for their Washington trip to capacity this week.

Tonight when the fire alarm is sounded at 6:30 12 carloads of the 40 or more classmen now planning to make the Washington junket will canvass the town completely, stopping at each house to ask for donations.

The seniors will leave for the nation's capital on April 19 and return about a week later.

A second class project for raising money is a square dance at Otto School this coming Saturday night. Hunter Young and his string band will play. Admission will be 75 cents and \$1.25. The public is invited.
