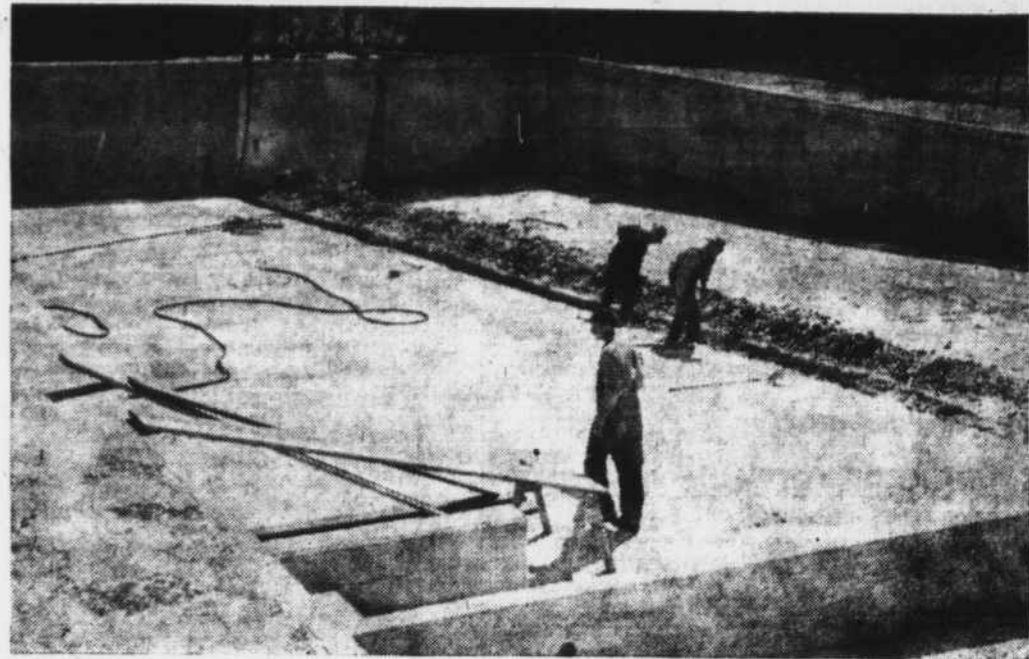

Add:

- 1 package (7 oz.) chocolate bits and
- 1/2 cup walnuts

Mix thoroughly. Drop by tsp. onto greased baking sheet about two inches apart and bake in moderate oven (375°F) 12 minutes.

Yield: Four dozen cookies.
