**Grand Jury Recommends
 New Courthouse For County**

Walking the well-worn path of numerous grand juries of the past, the jury for the April term of Superior Court recommends the construction of a new courthouse for Macon County.
 Noting cramped quarters at the county jail, the reports suggests that more space could be provided at a minimum of cost.
 A committee of jurymen, Lewis Moses, Walter Hall, Bill Pierson, and Ted Crunkleton, inspected the prison camp and reported it to be in "good condition".
 Recommendation for a new courthouse came from the entire 18-man jury.
 The men inspecting the courthouse, jurymen Fred Dehart, Clyde Morgan, and Tom Alley reported: "The courthouse was found in very poor condition. It needs a new paint job, cleaner rest rooms; the register of deeds' office needs more space for files; the clerk of court's office needs more filing space and room; the sheriff's office needs more space."
 Elmer Roten, John Conley, Claude Conley, Floyd Ramsey, Reid Elliott, and Vernon Cunningham inspected the county jail. Their findings: "The jail is being kept in an extra good manner, but more space is badly needed. Oftentimes, prisoners must be transported to other jails for the simple reason that there is not sufficient room, according to law, to accommodate them. We have reference to mixed sex and also to minors and mixed races. Additional space could be made at a minimum expense to the county."
 Foreman of the grand jury was George R. Pattillo.
 The jurymen completed their inspections Tuesday of last week.
