

Grants-In-Aid Awarded To Biological Station

Dr. Thelma Howell, executive director of the Highlands Biological Station, has announced the awarding of eight grants-in-aid for basic research at the station, which will begin its 29th session June 1.

They are made possible by a grant from the National Science Foundation and the research will cover a wide variety of fields, she said.

Dr. T. H. Eaton, Jr., of East Carolina College, and Dr. Albert E. Reynolds, of De Pauw University, both will study salamanders, while Dr. Henry M. Stevenson, Jr., of Florida State University,

a well-known ornithologist, will study birds as a quantitative basis for Merriam's Life Zones.

A study of the flora of southwestern North Carolina, as a part of a larger problem dealing with the flora of the Carolinas, will be undertaken by Dr. Albert E. Radford, of the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill.

Two graduate students from U. N. C. will also study plants. Dr. George F. Ramseur will take up the vascular flora of the high mountain communities and Duane F. Houck will work on Pynanthenum.

A. F. Mark, of Duke University, will investigate the grassy balds of the Southern Appalachians with particular reference to forest invasion as related to differences in biotic, edaphic, and microclimatic factors.

Allen Reback, of Wesleyan College, Macon, Ga., will investigate the relationship of soils and the oak communities in southwestern North Carolina.

Purchased Interests
Dr. Howell, who is with Wesleyan College, also announced that the Highlands station has purchased the interests of the High-

lands Community Hospital in the Illges cottages in Lindenwood Park. Having recently undergone extensive repairs, they are to be used as dormitories for the biological station investigators, she said.

Nature Classes Set
The executive director said the Museum of Natural History also has undergone repairs. The nature study classes for children, held each year in the museum, will start June 19, with Miss Cella Tomberlin, of Lowell, serving as nature study counselor.

Trustees To Meet
The board of trustees of the station will hold its annual meeting June 25 in the museum building. It will be followed by the annual meeting of the members.

Officers of the administration, in addition to Dr. Howell and Miss Tomberlin, are James J. Friauf, Vanderbilt University, president; Lewis Berner, University of Florida, vice-president; and Gertrude Harbison, of Highlands, treasurer.

Associates include H. M. Wright, of Highlands, botany; Toliver Crunkleton, of Highlands, ornithology; Lewis Dendy, of Highlands, mineralogy; Sara Weems, Valdosta State College, manager of Illges cottages; and Toliver Crunkleton, caretaker.
