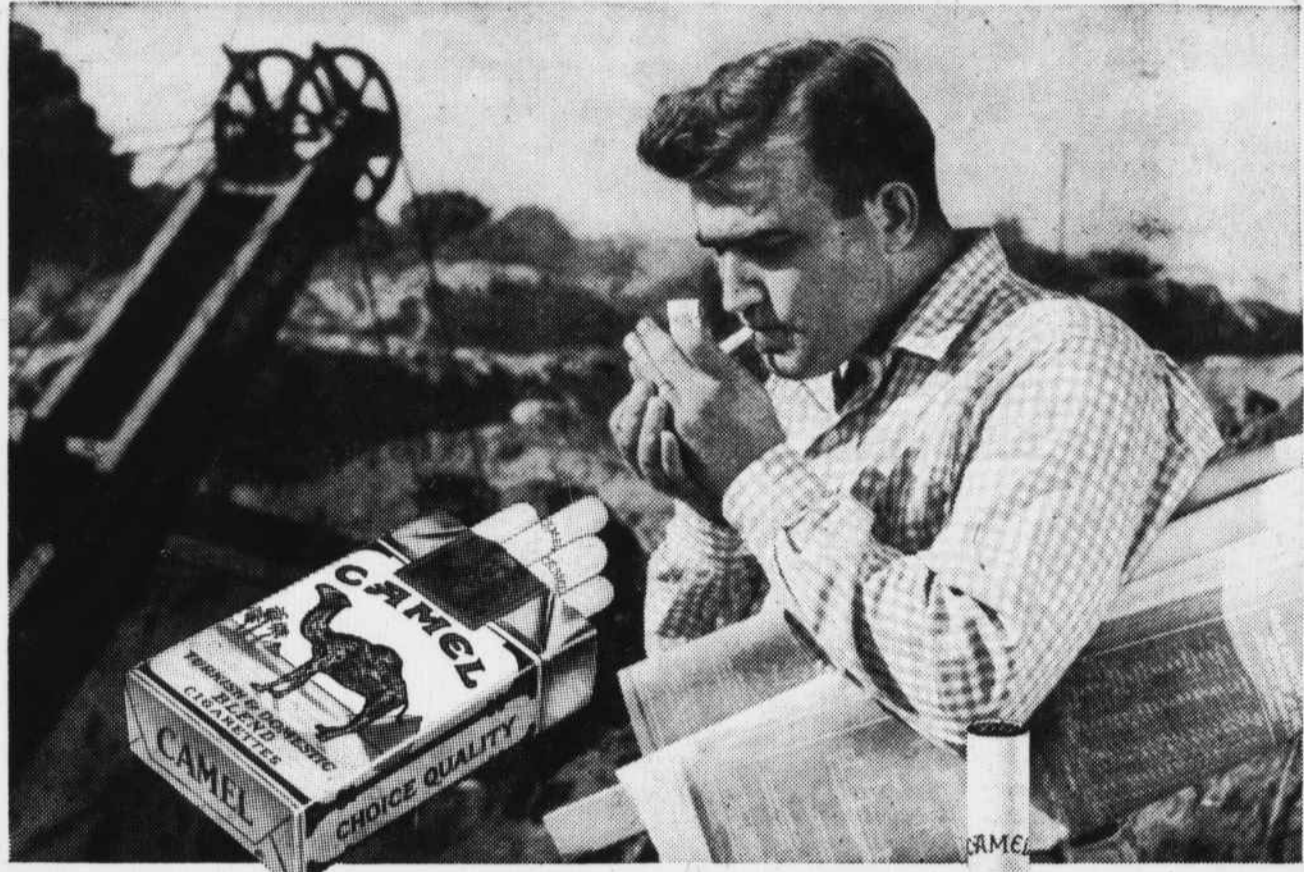

## This Week With Macon County Agents

Macon County had 1,031 farms with 6,983 acres of idle land, according to the 1950 census.

About a million trees have been set on about 1,000 acres of land since 1950, leaving 5,000 to 6,000 acres of land idle at present.

These 5,000-plus idle acres are not helping any one to live better, but are allowing tons of good soil to slip away down the river and out of production and wasting thousands of units of energy from the sun.

The white pine allotment from T.V.A. has been taken up and is in the process of being readjusted. Some shortleaf and loblolly are available in the county through T.V.A. without charge. White pines may be purchased from the N. C. Department of Conservation and Development for \$5.50 per thousand delivered, a few spruce are available (1,000 per farm) at \$15.50.

Numbers of people are considering growing Christmas trees as a supplement to their farm operation. Frazer Fir (Southern Balsam) and Norway Spruce are recommended for use in the production of Christmas trees. Red cedar is no longer recommended, as Macon County is now classified as a commercial producer of apples. Red cedar is a winter host of cedar apple rust, which is a disease that attacks apple trees. Southern Balsam (Frazier Fir) is one of the best Christmas trees. It is fast growing, very attractive, has a good odor and holds its needles for a long time after cutting. Northern exposures should be used for this tree. It will probably be seven to eight years after transplanting before being able to market four to five foot trees. A few table trees may be cut the fifth and sixth years.

Planting should be made from November 1 to April 1 in Macon County. Christmas trees should be spaced four by four feet, which will give 2,700 trees per acre. Plants should be open and the bundles cut open upon arrival and the plants healed in until ready to transplant to the field. A bucket of creamy mud should be used to carry the plants to the field. Small trees should be protected from grazing and fire. On extremely poor soils an addition of 500 pounds of 6-8-6 or 5-10-5 might be advisable.

Quotations from nurseries range Balsam at \$70 per thousand plants and Norway Spruce from \$30 to \$100 per thousand f. o. b. nursery. Using \$10 for fertilizer plus trees one can readily see that in an acre of trees \$100 to \$300 or more might be invested. In case 75% live, one should have 2000 trees to market. It is believed that one man or several close together should have several acres in order to induce city buyers to come in for a big truck load of trees.

Anyone interested should contact the farm agents' office for a list of nurseries supplying trees that may be grown for the Christmas market.
