



INSIDE SECRETS — Stuffing tricks can be the inside secrets to creating your elegant meat and poultry dishes for many occasions. Bread cubes soft or toasted or lightly toasted bread gives a delicious flavor to stuffing, and of course the right herbs, spices and fruits of your choice. Apple, sausage, or oyster stuffing goes well with chicken or turkey, depending on the likes and dislikes of people.

Bread Stuffing
1½ quarts soft ½-inch bread cubes
¼ teaspoon sage
¼ teaspoon pepper
¼ teaspoon salt
¼ cup butter
¼ c. finely chopped onion
¼ c. chopped celery
¼ c. milk
1 egg, slightly beaten

Toss bread cubes together with sage, salt and pepper. Melt butter in a skillet. Add onion and celery. Cook over low heat until onion

becomes transparent, stirring frequently. Combine beaten egg and milk. Toss lightly with toasted bread cubes. Add celery and onion with butter in which they were cooked. Use to stuff chicken, turkey or meat.

USE VACUUM — Your vacuum cleaner deserves good care. Like any other piece of equipment in the home it will operate efficiently only as long as it is cared for properly. (1) Read instruction book that comes with the cleaner. Keep it in a handy place and refer to it when necessary. (2) Remember the bag must be kept clean to hold the dirt but permit free flow of air. (3) Replace brushes when they become worn. (4) Hard sharp objects should not be picked up by a cleaner. (5) Your cleaner needs periodic check-ups at an authorized service dealer to keep it in good condition. (6) Dust that settles everywhere causes color changes in carpets and rugs. Heavy dirt causes damaging wear on carpets and rugs.

State College Answers Timely Farm Questions

Q. Are there important differences in dairy feeds?
A. Yes. Look at the feed tag when buying feed and compare

it with others. Although all feeds will not have the total energy value listed as total digestible nutrients (TDN) or terms of net energy, you will find the chemical analysis valuable for comparison of feed values. Give particular attention first to the fiber content of the feed, for the higher it is the lower the amount of available energy for milk production. The better feeds have six to eight per cent fiber content, whereas the cheaper mixtures may run as high as 12 to 15 per cent fiber. For every additional one per cent of fiber in the feed, the available energy drops around one and a half per cent, so watch the fiber.

Q. Should house plants be given fresh air?
A. Yes, but keep the plants out of drafts. Don't place them in front of fans or over radiators.

Q. What size sweet potatoes should farmers save for seed?
A. Save those roots one and a half inches in diameter or larger, preferably U. S. No. 1 size or larger. Smooth Jumbos are also excellent. The use of slips for bedding purposes is a very poor practice. They make small, weak plants.

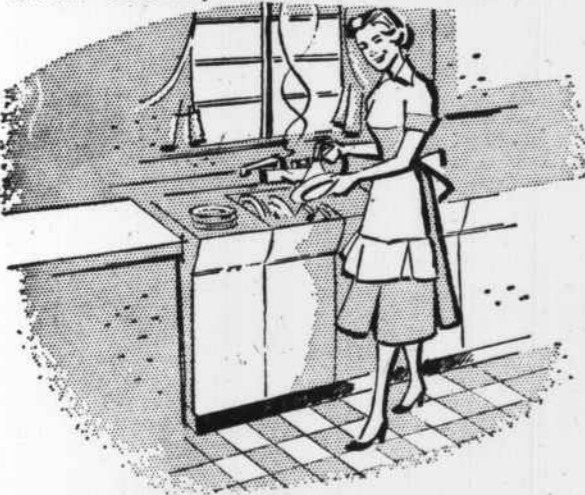
