**MRS. MURRAY
SUCCUMBS IN
ALBUQUERQUE**

**Franklin Native
Had Been Ill
Since Early Fall**

Mrs. Inez Crawford Murray, a native of Franklin and wife of Frank I. Murray, Jr., died Friday in an Albuquerque, New Mex., hospital of a diabetic condition.

Thirty years old, Mrs. Murray had been ill since early fall and had been hospitalized for treatment at intervals since. Her doctor allowed her to spend three hours at her home Christmas day with her husband, her mother, and other members of her family. She also left the hospital for a short time the Monday before her death.

Funeral services for Mrs. Murray were conducted yesterday (Wednesday) at 2 p. m. at the Franklin Methodist Church, of which she was a member. Officiating were the Rev. S. B. Moss, pastor, the Rev. M. W. Chapman, and the Rev. A. Rufus Morgan. Burial was in Woodlawn Cemetery.

Pallbearers were Robert Reece, Emory Hunnicutt, George Hunnicutt, Charles Hunnicutt, John G. Murray, and H. W. Cabe.

Daughter of Mrs. May Hunnicutt Crawford, of Franklin, and the late Gilmer L. Crawford, she was a graduate of Franklin High School and Gladwahl School of Laboratory Technique in St. Louis, Mo. Following her graduating from Gladwahl, she worked as a laboratory technician for the health department in New Orleans, La., and later as a technician with Dr. T. D. Slagle in Sylva. Tuberculosis forced her

resignation in Sylva and she entered the W. N. C. Sanatorium at Black Mountain, where she continued her career as a technician while undergoing treatment. After two and a half years she was released from the sanatorium and returned to Franklin. Here she was active in church and civic fields, including playing the lead in "Dear Ruth", a play staged by the Community Players. She and Mr. Murray were married Aug. 22, 1953, in Franklin and soon after moved to Albuquerque. There she worked as a laboratory technician until she became ill.

In addition to her mother and her husband, Mrs. Murray is survived by two brothers, Lee Crawford, of Raleigh, and Emory Crawford, a U. S. Navy air cadet stationed at Pensacola, Fla.; two sisters, Mrs. Fred Henry, of Greensboro, and Mrs. Henry P. Fell, of Albuquerque; and her grandmother, Mrs. Lee Crawford, of Franklin.

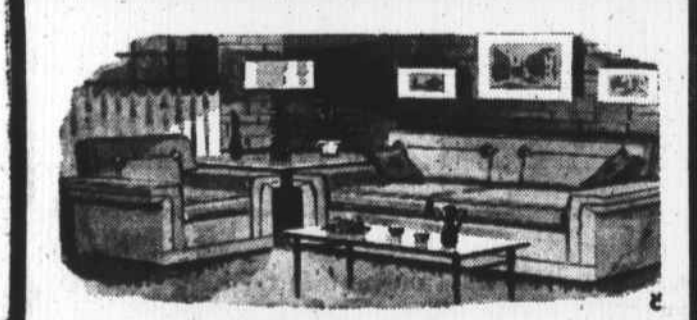
