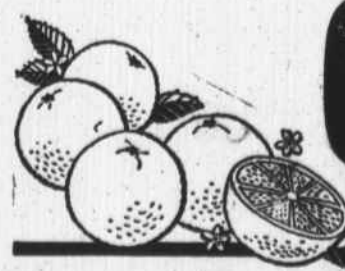

G. R. TALLEY DIES FRIDAY IN HOSPITAL

Clear Creek Man
'Bible Scholar';
Rites At Home

HIGHLANDS — George Rufus Talley, 71-year-old native and farmer of the Clear Creek community, died Friday about 1 p. m. at Highlands Community Hospital. He had been in declining health for a year and had been in the hospital for 24 hours.

Well-known as a church leader in his township, Mr. Talley was a frequent speaker at church events and he often filled pulpits at churches in the area. Although he had no formal education, he was recognized as a "Bible scholar". He was a member of the Clear Creek Baptist Church for 46 years and served for 22 years as superintendent of the Sunday School.

Funeral services were held Sunday at 2 p. m. at his home by the Rev. Wiley McCall, assisted by the Rev. Eldon Owens. Burial was in the Clear Creek cemetery. Son of the late William Riley and Mrs. Sarah Ann Galloway Talley, he was married in 1906 to Miss Lona Picklesimer, also of the Clear Creek section. She died in August, 1941.

Surviving Mr. Talley are a daughter, Mrs. Lawrence Bryson, of Highlands; five sons, Arthur, Leroy, and Elmer Talley, all of Highlands, Douglas Talley of Walthalla, S. C., and Corbin Talley, of Hoke Sound, Fla.; five brothers, Nathaniel, James (Jim), and Harrison Talley, of Highlands, John Talley, of Dillard, Ga., and Edward Talley, of Tamasee, S. C.; a sister, Mrs. Ransom Owens, of Satolah, Ga.; and several grand and great-grandchildren. Nephews serving as pallbearers were Kenneth Chastain, Hillard Chastain, Claude Talley, Harvey Talley, Carter Talley, and Lambert Talley.

'Pop' Simmons, Former Resident, Dies In Florida

Lawrence ("Pop") Simmons, who lived on Franklin, Route 4, until about four years ago, died at his home in Lake Placid, Fla., March 21. He was 72.

While living in Macon County, Mr. Simmons owned the old Charlie Ingram place (now owned by Lawrence Potts), on Cat Creek Road in Holly Springs community, and operated a stock farm. He moved from here to Florida.

Funeral services and burial were held Saturday in Miami.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Allie C. Simmons; three sons, Lawrence, Jr., and M. C., both of Miami, and N. E., of Jacksonville, Fla.; two daughters, Mrs. C. E. Dorris, of Lake Placid, and Mrs. George A. L. Cook, Jr., of Miami; and six grandchildren.
