**Garden Time . . .**

You may be interested in the recommended varieties of vegetables and the quantity of seed and the length of row necessary for a family of five. Succession cropping is good practice with such crops as snap beans and sweet corn.

**Beans (Snap):** Wade, Tendergreen, 2½ lbs.—250 ft. Beans (Pole): Kentucky Wonder 191, Stringless Blue Lake, 1 lb.—150 ft. Beans (Bush Lima): Henderson Bush, Ey, Thorogreen, Fordhook 242 (Large), 1¼ lb.—250 ft. Beans (Pole Lima): Carolina or Sieva, Challenger, 1 lb.—200 ft.

**Beets:** Green Top Bunching, Detroit Dark Red, 2½ oz.—125 ft. **Broccoli (Plants):** Texas 107, DeCicco, 60 plants—90 ft. **Cabbage (Plants):** Wakefield, Round Dutch, 100 plants—100 ft. 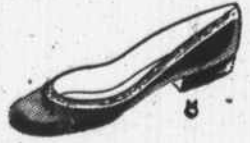
