However, "Safety Checked" windshield stickers will be affixed to those passing the in-spection. Vehicles failing to meet the requirement will be issued stickers after recommendations are met.

A 10-point check of vehicles to be made-brakes, front lights, rear lights, steering, tires, exhaust system, glass, windshield wipers, rear view mirror, and horn.

With daily hours of 9 a.m. to noon and 1 to 4 p. m., the safe-ty lane will be in Franklin on West Main Street, near the R.

For motorists of the High-lands area, the check lane will be set up Thursday (same hours as above) on Main Street in Highlands.
