COOKING CORNER Favorite Recipes OF MACON WOMEN

SWEET POTATO SOUFFLE

- 2 cups or 1 pint cooked and
- mashed potatoes 12 teaspoon salt
- 2 eggs
- 1/4 cup raisins 1 cup hot milk
- 2 teablespoons sugar 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 teaspoon nutmeg 14 cup broken nut meats Marshmallows

Left-over boiled or baked sweet potatoes may be used. Press through a vegetable press or ricer or mash well. Scald the milk and dissolve the sugar and salt in it, add the butter, stirring until melted. Add this mixture to the potatoes, mix and beat until smooth. Separate the eggs and beat yolks well, add them to the potato. Add the nutmeg. Beat whites stiff. Cut and fold them lightly into the potato and pour the mixture into a buttered baking dish. Quickly arrange the marshmallows one half inch apart on the top with the raisins in between the marshmallows. Place in a moderate oven and bake until the souffle is set and the marshmallows are toasted delicately. Serve at once.


