**MAN ALSO HURT —**  
**Negro Woman Has Left Arm Lopped Off By Corn Knife**

A 76-year-old Negro woman of the Sugarfork section had her left arm looped off by a razor-sharp corn knife about 5 o'clock Saturday afternoon during a fight between two Negro men at her home.

She is Mrs. Arie Crawford, who is reported recovering satisfactorily at Angel Clinic. Her arm was cut off about four inches above the wrist.

In the fight, one of the participants, George Carpenter, 40, had part of the palm of his left hand cut off.

Sheriff J. Harry Thomas said

it hasn't been established definitely whether Carpenter or Andrew Angel, 40, was wielding the huge corn knife, which still has not been found. Both men told him, however, it was a corn knife about two feet long.

The sheriff said the fight apparently stemmed from an argument at the supper table.

Mrs. Crawford is Angel's aunt. Both men have been charged with engaging in an affray, the sheriff said, and a preliminary hearing is scheduled when the two injured parties are released from the hospital.
