Tallent Takes Part In NATO 'Deepwater'

Pfc. Billy J. Tallent, son of Mr. and Mrs. Carl S. Tallent, of Franklin, took part in the North Atlantic Treaty Organization exercise, "Deepwater", with the reinforced 6th Marine Regiment, according to the Fleet Home Town News Center.

The exercise was held Sept. 24-28 and included an amphibious assault landing on the beaches of the Saros Bay area off the Thracian Peninsula of Western Turkey. One of a series of regular exercises, "Deepwater", was designed to test and train the military defensive capabilities of the land, sea, and air forces of the participating NATO nations.

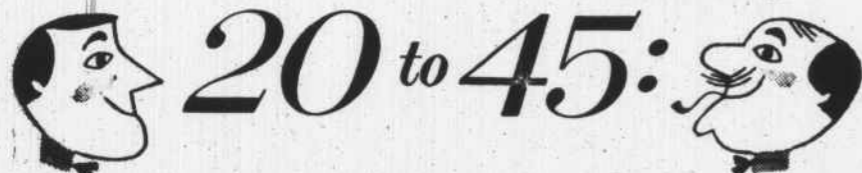
On completion of the exercise, the Marine regiment was scheduled to return to its home base at Camp Lejeune.
