A safe "rapid fire" new way of treating lack of iron in the body, the most common deficiency disease among babies, is reported by a specialist at the Los Angeles Children's Hospital. The treatment is injected into the muscle of an iron-dextran compound. The specialist reports in the medical journal, Pediatrics, that as little as three injections will not only cure a baby's anemia, but will provide it with enough iron stores to meet its growth needs for a year.
